Rollout/Release

This Issue Paper was released live on the CAST website and rolled out at three venues in Washington, D.C. On Monday, April 28, 2014, CAST joined with the National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research (NC-FAR) to host two research seminars—the Capitol Hill labeling seminars were presented to Senate staffers in the morning and to House staffers at a noon luncheon. Task Force Chair Dr. Alison Van Eenennaam, Department of Animal Science, University of California–Davis, spoke at the sessions. The labeling issue was also front and center during a late-afternoon panel discussion cohosted by CAST and FoodPolicy.US. Dr. Van Eenennaam was joined by Dr. Mark Walton, Recombinetics; Thomas Redick, GEEC Law Practice; and Karil Kochenderfer, LINKAGES, on the panel. Dr. Charles Weiss, Georgetown University, was the moderator.

- William Lesser and Susan E. Lynch, **Dyson School of Applied Economics and Management, Cornell University**, mentioned this Issue Paper in a paper titled "Costs of Labeling Genetically Modified Food Products in N.Y. State." This paper discussed the consequences of adopting a law mandating the labeling of genetically modified foods and aimed to allow a more fully informed discussion of the law in question.
- The Snack Food Association used this Issue Paper as a resource for their webinar on GE Labeling on June 4, 2014.
- Intelligence Squared U.S., a debate series broadcast live from New York City on December 3, 2014, hosted a lengthy, entertaining debate with a timely premise: GMOs, Yes or No? Robert Fraley (Monsanto) and Alison Van Eenennaam (UC-Davis and CAST task force chair) argued for the motion; Charles Benbrook (Center for Sustaining Agriculture) and Margaret Mellon (Union of Concerned Scientists) spoke against the motion. The "For" team was declared the winner of the live audience vote: 60% For, 31% Against, 9% Undecided.
- Alison Van Eenennaam joined five other invited speakers who testified before the **U.S. House Committee on Energy and Commerce; Subcommittee on Health** on December 10, 2014. Her presentation was titled "Examining FDA's Role in Regulation of Genetically Modified Food Ingredients" and she cited CAST Issue Paper 54 as a major resource for her testimony.
- A nationally renowned animal scientist spoke about genetically modified animals at the **University of Nebraska-Lincoln Heuermann Lecture** on January 13, 2015. Alison Van Eenennaam, a Cooperative Extension specialist in animal genomics and biotechnology in the Department of Animal Science at the University of California, Davis, spoke at 7 p.m. at the Nebraska Innovation Campus conference center. The title of Van Eenennaam's talk was "Genetically Modified Animals: The Facts, the Fear Mongering and the Future."

When I left UC-Davis for the FDA, I did not realize how close I would be to this issue. My staff worked on the guidance document you referred to and I headed the U.S. delegation when this issue was considered in Codex. It is a very emotional issue. It is so important for those regions considering a labeling requirement to understand the federal policy and the rationale behind it. I think your article does a great job in that regard. I have frequently had to discuss with proponents of labeling for safety reasons that you cannot label yourself out of a safety issue—if the product is not safe, it should not be on the market. As noted in your article, for those who promote choice, voluntary labeling is the most effective route."
