



# CAST STRATEGIC PLAN



Early in 2015, CAST created a Strategic Planning Committee chaired by the president-elect with two representatives from each CAST work group. The process began with a thorough analysis of significant industry, global, and agriculture changes, as well as analysis of key assumptions that should drive CAST's strategy. Input from CAST members and stakeholders was included using information gathered through surveys. The committee defined three major initiatives as core areas of focus for strategic planning. This was presented to and further developed by the CAST Board of Representatives during a special session of the 2015 annual meeting held in October. Strategies to achieve these goals, plus work assignments, timelines, and measurement methods were further defined and refined through the CAST work groups in early 2016. The final draft of the 2016–2020 CAST Strategic Plan

was presented and approved by the Board of Directors during their spring meeting in April 2016.

### BORLAUG CAST COMMUNICATION AWARD

Dr. Kevin Folta, Chair of the Horticultural Sciences Department of the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Aqricultural Sciences, was announced as the recipi-

ent of the 2016 Borlaug CAST Communication Award (BCCA) at the World Bank in Washing-

ton, D.C., on April 21. CAST and Du-Pont hosted the event, an afternoon that began with a presentation from 2015 BCCA winner Dr. Channapatna S. Prakash titled Gene-edited Crops: More Palatable to GMO Critics and Consumers?

A teacher, mentor, researcher, and organizer. Dr. Folta focuses on clear. credible information. He knows how to communicate science to nonscientific audiences—and how to train scientists, farmers, physicians, and students to perform public outreach in scientific or controversial topics.

On October 12, Dr. Folta was honored at a World Food Prize side event where he gave a memorable keynote address: Unveiling Our Halo—Building Trust with a Concerned Consumer. After a breakfast sponsored by DuPont, the session began with short remarks by CAST Executive Vice President Kent Schescke and DuPont's Vice President of Research and Development Neal Gutterson. Julie Borlaug Larson of the Norman E. Borlaug Institute for International Agriculture spoke about Folta's communication abilities,

saying that her "grandfather would choose Kevin for the award." Crispin Taylor, Executive Director of the American Society of Plant Biologists, introduced the award recipient.

Dr. Folta's presentation centered on the challenges scientists and the agricultural community have when working with a concerned public. He thinks scientists must explain the evidence-based risks and benefits of agricul-

> tural biotechnology, and that can be tough to do in an age of misinformation. "Lead with your ethics—facts by themselves won't work," said Folta. "We need to listen, explain, and gain their trust by developing a shared understanding."

> Illumination, Dr. Folta's blog, covers recent events at the interface between society and science, and his weekly podcast (Talking Biotech) discusses genetic improvements in agriculture and medicine. He has

designed a communication workshop that teaches scientists how to properly engage a skeptical public.

The morning also included a presentation by Amit Dhingra as task force chair of the forthcoming Agricultural Innovation series keynote paper, "Technologies on the Shelf." Todd Peterson, a business development expert with Sustain (a Land O'Lakes company), introduced Dr. Dhingra and went on to moderate a panel discussion among Folta, Dhingra, Neal Gutterson, and Sally Rockey (Executive Director, Foundation for Food and Agriculture Research).


