

Summary of Activities June–September 2018

CONGRATS, DR. JUAN TRICARICO:

In an annual election at CAST, Dr. Juan Tricarico—vice president of sustainability research at the Innovation Center for U.S. Dairy—was chosen as the President-Elect for 2018–2019. He will officially assume his responsibilities at the conclusion of CAST's fall board meeting in October. In 2019–2020, he will become the 47th President of CAST.

GENE EDITING ROLLOUT:

On July 9, CAST released Issue Paper 60, *Genome Editing in Agriculture: Methods, Applications, and Governance*, in Washington, D.C. Dr. Adam Bogdanove, a professor of plant pathology and plant-microbe biology at Cornell University, presented highlights at an event cohosted by

the Association of Public and Land-grant

Universities. The National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research hosted a House of Representatives lunch seminar and an afternoon Senate presentation.



FREE-RANGE POULTRY ROLLOUT:


